Toyama Bay Sushi

When visiting Toyama, the land famous seafood and rice, "Toyama Bay Sushi" is a must to eat.

"Toyama Bay Sushi" is an sushi that conveys the richness of the seasonal seafood and the pride of the area.

A wide variety of fish inhabits Toyama Bay thanks to the 4,000-meter difference between the Tateyama Mountain Range's 3,000-meter-high peaks and the bay itself, with depths of 1,000 meters. The melted snow that pours from this range in the Northern Alps into the bay creates this miraculous environment.

World Heritage Site, the Historic Villages of Gokayama/Ainokura (pm)



Gokayama consists of 40 small villages. The 2 villages, **Ainokura** and **Suganuma**, are registered as World Heritage Sites along with Shirakawago's Ogimachi village in Gifu Prefecture.

Ainokura is the largest village of traditional thatched farmhouses in the Gokayama area, with around 20 houses. 100 to 350 years old houses at Ainokura create a nostalgic atmosphere of a bygone Japan. Most of the houses are still private residences, some serve as cafes, museums, and even guesthouses for stay. The village scenery is beautiful in each season, but more in the winter when the houses are covered with snow. Staying overnight is the best way to enjoy the captivating sights including seasonal illumination events.

L'evo is an exclusive, gourmand-focused hotel near amid mountains and unspoiled countryside in Toga, southwestern Toyama Prefecture. Its Michelin-starred restaurant serves highly original dishes that make use of vegetables and herbs from L'evo's own farm, located adjacent to the restaurant. The soil used here has been formulated from the perspective of a chef rather than that of a farmer, something that L'evo cites as an element of its avant-garde regional cuisine. Wild game, such as deer and boar meat, is sourced directly from local hunters. This reservation-only restaurant is also open to non-hotel guests.

Toyama City Center

Known as the "City of glass Art", Toyama City is home to the fascinating Toyama Glass Art Museum, as well as many other museums and shops, such as traditional oriental medicine store. Get a bird's eye view of the city and surrounding area from many observation decks, or take a relaxing cruise along one of the beautiful canals. Toyama Castle Park and Kansui Park, where the world's most beautiful Starbucks is located, are easily accessible by the modern tram system that services the city.

Historic streets with shipping buildings from the Meiji Period

The Iwase district Toyama was a thriving port town from the beginning of the Edo Period (1603-1867), serving the Kitamae cargo ships that crossed the Sea of Japan. An important highway called the Hokkoku Kaido used to run through this area, lined with Kitamae shipping buildings. Many buildings from the Meiji Period (1868-1912) remain now, preserving much of the district's history.

2 Shogetsu (Lunch)







Shogetsu is a long-established restaurant founded in 1911 (Meiji 44). It is located in a quiet place east of Toyama Port, down a small alley from Iwase Beach. Here you can enjoy seasonal fish caught off the coast of Toyama Bay. Toyama's signature dish of glass shrimp is exquisite. Sashimi, and fried fuku dango shaped into small pieces. Thanks to the owner's ingenious cooking techniques, Toyama Bay's delicacies have been made even more delicious. You will be able to spend a luxurious time in a room with a calm and historical atmosphere while looking out at the charming garden.
